AIM

CERVICAL CANCER IS A LARGELY PREVENTABLE DISEASE. HOWEVER, DESPITE THE AVAILABILITY OF EFFECTIVE PREVENTIVE MEASURES, BARRIERS EXIST WHICH OFTEN LIMIT ACCESS ESPECIALLY IN LOW- AND MIDDLE-INCOME COUNTRIES. THIS SYMPOSIUM AIMS TO EXPLORE STRATEGIES TO UNDERSTAND AND ADDRESS THE DISPARITIES IN CERVICAL CANCER PREVENTION, FOCUSING ON SOLUTIONS TO OVERCOME THESE OBSTACLES AND PROMOTE EQUITABLE ACCESS TO CERVICAL CANCER PREVENTION WORLDWIDE.
