

Summer school on designing, evaluating and implementing digital public health interventions in Bremen, Germany

The Leibniz ScienceCampus Digital Public Health (LSC DiPH) is organizing a 5-day summer school on designing, evaluating and implementing digital public health interventions. The summer school will take place from **10th to 14th of July 2023 in Bremen, Germany**. The summer school is aimed at researchers, PhD or Master students and professionals from the fields of public health, epidemiology, psychology, human-computer interaction and related disciplines. The course language is English. The summer school will consist of a mix of lectures, seminars, expert discussions and hands-on group activities.

Course participants will receive a broad introduction to the design, evaluation and implementation of digital public health interventions. Participants will learn about frameworks relevant for digital public health interventions as well as opportunities, challenges, and different methods for their design, evaluation, and implementation.

The summer school will include a range of presenters, including Prof. Dr. Hajo Zeeb (Leibniz Institute for Prevention Research and Epidemiology – BIPS), Prof. Dr. Benjamin Schüz (University of Bremen), Prof. Daniela Fuhr (Leibniz Institute for Prevention Research and Epidemiology- BIPS) and Prof. Dr. Ansgar Gehardus (University of Bremen).

The costs (400 Euro per participant) include the costs of the summer school, lunch and refreshments for each of the five days, the guided social activity in Bremen, and the summer school dinner. Accommodation and travel are not included in the costs. **A number of travel grants of 500 or 1.000 Euro are available.**
